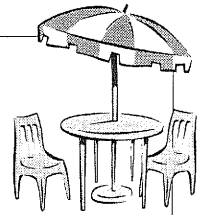

Building and Grounds Committee By Howard Krauth

The many projects planned by Building and Grounds make this an exciting time for the Tradition. In 2004 we intend to start on seal coating the roads in our development, which is to be the first of nine phases in this type of project.



In 2003 we will be completing Phase 2 of our drainage investigation and repair. The bridge that leads into the Tradition will be repaired. The back berm will have the Pampas Grass removed and replaced with shrubs, which requires less maintenance. As you may have noticed we are in the process of our Fall plantings combining over 3100 annuals and approximately 80 perennials. The planning of the plantings are being done by volunteers from the Tradition, outside help is used for the actual planting.

Our Pool and Tennis Courts require some extensive repairs, which will be taken care of so we can continue to enjoy these amenities.

We have over 14 Common Areas with sprinkler systems, including wells, which are checked and maintained by volunteers. This would be extremely costly to have a private contractor do this task. This is just one of many projects our volunteers do. Volunteers make our community a better place to live by devoting their time and talents. We can't keep relying on only the current volunteers and are always looking for more help. If anyone wishes to help even with just an hour or two, to do some volunteering, please contact me. Don't underestimate the impact your time may have!

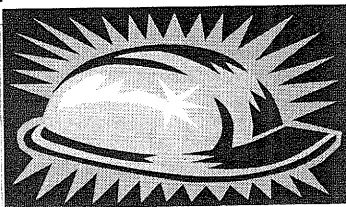

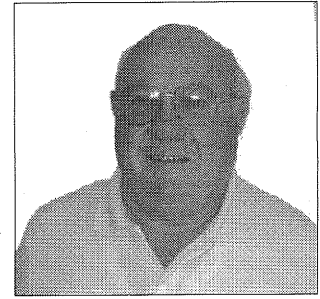


A request from the Georgetown water meter reader.

Chairman's Corner By Ron Belbutowski



We have been fortunate to get past summer and the hurricane season without The Tradition being in the path of any severe summer thunderstorms. Despite a few anxious days while we all watched the progress of Isabel in September, we did not experience even a modest gale. Nor did we have to cope with high surf over at the beach. Summer of 2003 did not feature any extremely hot weather and rainfall was adequate to minimize the need for irrigation of lawns and landscaping. This was a boon to our maintaining our maintenance budget.

There are a number of things which have been happening in our community which I believe you all should be aware of. This year it has become increasingly obvious that we are not getting the same level of volunteering as previously has been the case. Accordingly, your Board of Directors has agreed that we need to have a paid on site buildings and grounds manager. We have engaged one of our Tradition residents, Howard Krauth, to fulfill this need, beginning in October. Howard has previous experience in this type of responsibility. We are sure that we will have a smoother, more organized buildings and grounds maintenance program. Howard will be organizing and encouraging volunteers for appropriate activities. He will also be overseeing our various maintenance contractors and interfacing with the Board of Directors as well as with our association manager, Tom Finley of Chicora.

We have had several projects going on, in addition to the normal landscape maintenance by the Pryor group. During October we had a contractor remove over 220 pampas grass plants along Kings River Road and Willbrook Blvd. We will be planting shrubs which do not require the level of annual maintenance that the pampas grass does. Our landscape contractor, Pryor, will be able to properly trim the new plantings which will complement the myrtle and other shrubs which create a visual and noise barrier for the homes which abut Kings River Road and Willbrook Blvd.

In November we will be having rehabilitation work done on the community pool. This will require that the pool be drained and will also keep us in compliance with the most recent regulations covering such pools.

We are in the process of putting together the 2004 budget. We anticipate that there will be additional expenditures as our community continues to grow older. We have reserves to cover a number of rehabilitation items which involve our roadways, gatehouse, landscaping, and irrigation systems. We anticipate that after several years of no change in assessments, we will see a modest increase in same. Even so, our total assessments, including those of Litchfield By The Sea, are lower than those of the other regimes in our area.

I am once again encouraging all our Tradition residents to assist in keeping our neighborhood looking good, by attending to the maintenance of your property. Our community will maintain and increase its value only to the extent that each owner and renter maintains their own property. Our volunteers are doing their best to monitor our areas for compliance with the spirit as well as the letter of our Declaration, which places the responsibility for maintaining a neat and orderly property upon the owners and/or renters. There are a number of items in our Declaration which need to be brought to the attention of all property owners, since it appears that many residents and absentee owners have forgotten that these requirements of ownership are their responsibility. Refer to Article N of the Declaration and you will find that Section 4 specifies that "All landscaping shall be maintained in a neat and orderly condition. Any weeds or diseased or dead lawn, trees, ground cover or shrubbery shall be removed and replaced. All lawn areas shall be neatly mowed and trees and shrubs shall be neatly trimmed." For anyone who is not in compliance with this part of the declaration, you should be prepared to receive notification that you are not meeting your responsibility in this regard.

You should also be aware of the restrictions contained in Article VII of the Declaration. Among these restrictions is the prohibition of any free standing structures other than a single family house. Mailboxes are to meet prescribed standards. There are vehicle and storage restrictions relating to autos, camper trailers, boat trailers, and other transportation items. There is also a restriction prohibiting furniture, bird baths, statues, and other decorative items such as glass globes and plastic or ceramic animal likenesses in the front yard of the properties.

Some residents have been lax in meeting the requirements of these restrictions, which are meant to keep our community attractive and not cluttered, as was the intention of the Declaration and probably one of the reasons you have chosen to locate at The Tradition. Your Board of Directors, Covenants Committee, and Architectural Review Board are committed to upholding terms of our Declaration. We need and ask for your total cooperation in this regard.

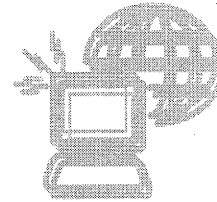

TRADITION PROPERTY OWNER'S COVENANTS COMMITTEE

There are a number of items in our Declaration which need to be brought to the attention of all property owners, since it appears that many residents and absentee owners have forgotten that these requirements of ownership are their responsibility. Refer to Article IV of the Declaration and you will find that Section 4 specifies that "All landscaping shall be maintained in a neat and orderly condition. Any weeds or diseased or dead lawn trees, ground cover or shrubbery shall be removed and replaced. All lawn areas shall be neatly mowed and trees and shrubs shall be neatly trimmed." For anyone who is not in compliance with this part of the declaration, you should be prepared to receive notification that you are not meeting your responsibility in this regard.

You should also be aware of the restrictions contained in Article VII of the Declaration. Among these restrictions is the prohibition of any free standing structures other than a single family house. Mailboxes are to meet prescribed standards. There are vehicle and storage restrictions relating to autos, camper trailers, boat trailers, and other transportation items. There is also a restriction prohibiting furniture, bird baths, statues, and other decorative items such as glass globes and plastic or ceramic animal likenesses in the front yard of the properties.

Some residents have been lax in meeting the requirements of these restrictions, which are meant to keep our community attractive and not cluttered, as was the intention of the Declaration and probably one of the reasons you have chosen to locate at The Tradition. Homeowner Information



Pest control problems and companies that provide services for these homeowners problems is of concern to many members of our community.

Elliott Dodson discovered termites in the home that he and Darlene purchased recently on Tradition Club Drive. This property was covered by a termite bond with Lightning Pest Control. Because of the difficulties with Lightning about the infestation, as well as with Lightning's fee schedule, Mr. Dodson sought assistance from the State Department of Pesticide Regulations and was able to obtain valuable help.

Since termite control is an important issue to Tradition residents who use the services of various pest control companies, Elliott says he would be happy to share his experience with anyone who is interested. Another possibility, depending upon the number of interested homeowners, would be to arrange a meeting with Mr. Barry Kostyk of the above mentioned regulatory department. RUST REMOVAL



Back in September the Covenants Committee distributed a blue flyer into your newspaper slot. This flyer covered the subject of iron/rust prevention and removal. It was based on experiences of several residents. If you have a rust problem on sidewalks, driveways, gutters or other home surfaces but have misplaced the flyer, you can still obtain one by speaking to Bill or Jeannette Renault.

We have previously mentioned that there are several companies who service homeowners who want to remove mold from the roofs, as well as power wash exterior surfaces. These are services which help maintain the attractiveness of your property.

We hear that some homeowners are talking about removing trees that are healthy but not in a "convenient location" on the property. The Architectural Review Board **WILL NOT** grant permission for these removals. Fines are permissible for unauthorized removal of healthy trees. If you have any tree questions, you better contact the ARB first.
