



The Willbrook Boulevard Path Association (WBPA) met with the Presidents of its member Homeowners Associations on February 18, 2026. At that meeting, the WBPA discussed its move to self-management in an effort to more wisely manage its financial resources, while providing more responsive service to its members.

2025 was a very important year for the WBPA. Not only were we able to resurface the Path to make it a more pleasurable experience for all users, but it was the first full year of reopening the Path to golf carts. The WBPA wants to thank each and every resident for not only adhering to the new South Carolina state laws, but to being very respectful to all users of the Path. With the warmer weather soon upon us, more and more residents and visitors will, once again, be using and enjoying the Path. Additionally, the WBPA anticipates more E-Bikes will be using the Path this year than in the past. The WBPA wants to take this opportunity to inform our residents of its policies concerning E-Bikes.

An E-bike is defined as a bicycle with a small, electric motor that provides power assistance to pedaling. There are three classes of E-Bikes with Classes 1 and 2 providing power for speeds up to 20 miles per hour, and Class 3 providing power for speeds up to 28 miles per hour. For each class, the bicycle must have pedals. In South Carolina, Class 3 E-Bike riders must be at least 16 years of age. All E-Bikes outlined above will be allowed on the Path; however E-Bikes with no pedals will not. This type of E-Bike provides power for much higher speeds and is intended for off-road use only. To ensure the safety of all Path users, walkers, joggers, bikers, and golf cart riders, the **WBPA is instituting a 15 mile per hour speed limit for all E-Bikes and golf carts.** Signs reflecting this new speed limit are being installed this week. We believe adherence to this speed will promote safety for all users of the Path.

The WBPA was extremely pleased with last year's use of the Path. Most users were very respectful of the new South Carolina laws and aware of, and courteous to, the other users on the Path. We commend your diligence and appreciate your shared concern for safety on the Path. The WBPA also wants to thank all residents and Homeowners Associations for their continued support of the Path and its benefits to our community. We look forward to a safe and beautiful summer in 2026.
