
Our final meeting of the year will take place this month at Austin's with a luncheon and presentation of the new slate of officers.



Ever wonder how long your back swing should be? Here's a simple way to find out.

Hold the club with only your right hand (if you play right - handed) and take the club back to the point where you would feel most powerful if you could use only your right hand to swing the club. I'll bet you're not back all that far and that your elbow is bent and your hand is very far from your head. That's all you need. Now go ahead and let the club come back farther. It feels terrible there, doesn't it? You might even try hitting a few balls with only your right hand holding the club. Use a 7 iron and put the ball on a tee. You're apt to surprise yourself when you discover how well you can do it! Good luck with your game.



## **Gourmet Diners 2005**


